Grant Writing and Fiscal Sponsorship

The CPC can assist community organizations with **grant writing**, having successfully submitted several grant applications including a \$300,000 Maine Department of Economic Development Community Development Housing Block Grant to rehabilitate unhealthy and unsafe housing in Mount Vernon, and several others (see over). The block grant allowed 17 of our citizens to rehabilitate their homes, which not only improved their lives and safety, but also improved the overall housing stock in our town. The CPC acts as a **fiscal sponsor** for Mount Vernon organizations without a non-profit designation so they may also accept donations and win grant awards.

Community Education & Outreach

CPC has been a community leader, organizing **public forums** to garner input from citizens about what is important to its residents and to **disseminate information** of interest including talks from local legislators, GOMaine, KVCA, Mid Maine Time Bank, and USDA Rural Development. It has sponsored **presentations** on topics including cluster development and smart growth, invasive aquatic plants and watersheds.

The CPC publishes a **business directory** every five years featuring businesses in Mount Vernon and Vienna. The directory has a distribution of 1,000, and is free to the businesses and residents. - CPC was founded in 1999 and received its 501(c)(3) designation in 2002.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Awarded the 2005 Governor's Good Service Award

- ★ Implemented a \$300,000 Maine Department of Economic Development Community Development Block Housing grant in 2003 to **rehabilitate unhealthy and unsafe housing** in Mount Vernon received the "Governor's Good Neighbor Award."
- ★ Published **1,000 Business Directories** in 2008 and 2013, featuring local businesses in Mount Vernon and Vienna.
- ★ Started a **Fuel Assistance Fund** in 2008 to keep eligible families warm during the winter.
- ★ Organized three annual meetings from 2010-2012 to discuss long-term protection strategies for Minnehonk Lake; helped implement two **lakefront buffer plantings** on Minnehonk Lake.
- ★ Received a \$7,000 grant to conduct the **Minnehonk and Hopkins Pond watershed survey** in 2012. Received \$6,975 in grants to **stabilize the rope swing site** on Minnehonk Lake in 2015. We continue to maintain the rope swing site annually.
- ★ Worked with the Maine DOT and the town **to improve the storm drainage in the village**. In 2014 MDOT provided \$100,000 to install new catch basins, with a \$20,000 match from the town.
- ★ Received a \$10,000 in grants in 2014-2015 as fiscal sponsor for "**Neighbors Driving Neighbors,**" a program that provides **transportation for those who cannot drive** in Mount Vernon, Fayette, Vienna, Rome and Belgrade.

CURRENT PROJECTS

Making Mount Vernon a Great Place to Live

- ★ In association with the Greater Minnehonk Lake Association, **organized the "Loon Lap"**, a walk around Minnehonk and Hopkins Pond in August 2014, 2015 and 2016
- ★ Working with the Select Board and property owners **to restore a wetland** adjacent to the Fire Department and Minnehonk Lake.
- ★ Working with Select Board to renovate Minnehonk's beach and combine Fire Department and boat ramp roads.
